Dr. Elliot saw a chance to support small to midsize businesses by offering both virtual and in-person office assistance. This shift in focus led to the discovery that hiring young to middle-aged adults with disabilities could be a highly rewarding experience with a workforce that is dedicated, punctual, and tech-savvy.

The Chrysalis Spectrum Foundation's commitment to empowering individuals with disabilities and enhancing their career opportunities remains at the core of its mission.


Chrysalis Spectrum Administrative Work Initiative

Through Chrysalis Spectrum Foundation work initiative programs, we are able to provide young to middle-aged people with a disability with valuable tools to help them achieve work in their preferred setting while helping businesses become more inclusive in hiring people with a disability. Our goal is to teach administrative/office job duties and get businesses to pledge to hire more individuals with a disability who want to work remotely or in person. This includes:

- · Teaching administrative job skills to work remotely or in an office environment
- Partnering with businesses to make their work environment inclusive to people with a disability
- Providing work transportation vouchers for hired car service
